

Deacon Joseph Jones, 57, of Detroit, was a parishioner at St. Augustine & St Monica Parish, but is now assigned to St. Charles Borromeo Parish. A convert to the Catholic faith, Deacon Joseph brings 29 years of invaluable experience in Christian ministerial service as a former Pentecostal Protestant minister.

Born in Detroit, **Deacon Joseph** attended Notre Dame Prep High School and graduated in 1985. He attended Michigan State University and graduated in 1991. He and his wife, Bianca, have three adult children: Alexes, Joseph and Bethanye. He works as president and CEO or Visions Consultants, LLC.

Deacon Joseph views his vocation to the diaconate as an answer to God's call to serve the Church and wider community.

"We are emboldened by the Holy Spirit to carry out the mission and testimony of Jesus Christ, in all that we do, and to show the image of Jesus to everyone we encounter," **Deacon Joseph** said. "My experience and journey of being a Pentecostal Protestant minister and coming into full communion with the Catholic Church has instilled a desire to further serve Christ's Church and evangelize the singularity of the Body of Christ to all of God's people."

Deacon Joseph served his parish internship at St. Mary, Our Lady Queen of Families Parish in Warren, under the supervision of Deacon Stan Avery.

In his spare time, **Deacon Joseph** enjoys reading, research, sports and puzzles.






