

Thoughts for Today's Readings "With a Trayer..."

Sunday Food for Your Soul

Dear Family Friends and Parishioners, Greetings to each of you for a beautiful and blessed autumn.

To aid us in our desire for and progress in prayer, below are some personal suggestions of mine. They are basic reminders, yet you might find some of them helpful and encouraging. Enjoy.

SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR PERSONAL PRAYER

- 1. Find good places and times to pray—even brief times
- 2. Calm your body and spirit—let go of stress and strain
- 3. Be patient: "let the dust (of your mind) settle" at the beginning of prayer and when distracted—a mantra or praying out loud can help you find focus
- 4. As you begin prayer, show reverence by means of a word and/or a gesture
- 5. Personally address the Father, Son, and/or Holy Spirit, and ask for light and grace
- 6. Express your concrete desire for what you wish and seek in prayer
- 7. Be simple—at times you might simply speak your heart, its troubles, joys, and desires
- 8. Pray in a way that fits your particular spirituality, personality, temperament, and/or style
- 9. Affectionate and quiet presence with and to the Lord can also be a prayer, and/or lead to prayer
- 10. Don't strain—highly controlled prayer is self-centered and shortsighted anyway
- 11. Review your prayer, but try not to evaluate it, especially while praying
- 12. In an easy yet fitting way, be imaginative and playful with Scripture (and prayer)
- 13. Pray your specific reality, even if it includes negative feelings
- 14. Don't rush—wherever you find some kind of fruit (consolation) in your prayer, remain there longer, even if you don't "finish" all of what you were intending
- 15. Give ample time to prayer but, remember, longer prayer (in and of itself) is not necessarily better prayer
- 16. As you conclude, commend your prayer to the Lord
- 17. Faithfulness to prayer—felt consolation or not—and the self-surrender that such faithfulness entails, is the acceptable offering
- 18. Within and beyond our time of set prayer, <u>abiding</u> prayer is the prayer of seeking, finding, receiving, and cooperating with God's presence in all things and people and labors throughout the day

An Advisory from The Archdiocese of Detroit Department of Communications

Regarding The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints

Each of us in the Catholic faith community has a responsibility to reduce error, avoid schism, and promote ecclesiastical communion. To that end, the Archdiocese of Detroit shares the following information about a group operating in Southfield and elsewhere called "The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints," which presents itself as "a group of Catholic clergy offering the traditional sacraments."

As of August 2025, the group was renting space in The Church of the Redeemer, an Episcopal church in Southfield. Previously, they occupied space in Taylor at the Little Rose Chapel Shrine, which has no affiliation with the Archdiocese of Detroit. An individual identifying himself as clergy from The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints has visited Archdiocesan parishes in the area.

In the interest of truth and to avoid confusion among the faithful, we must clarify that, as best we are able to tell, The Society of Our Lady, Queen of all Saints is not an organization in ecclesiastical communion with the Catholic Church. Catholics are advised to avoid association with this group.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter. Let us pray that God will bring all Christian communities into full communion with the Roman Catholic Church, so that we may all be one. (cf. John 17:21)

Parish Nurse News and Notes

Shining a Light in the Darkness: Understanding and Responding to Domestic Violence

October is *Domestic Violence Awareness Month*, a time to shed light on a hidden yet heartbreaking reality affecting individuals and families—often in silence.

Domestic violence is not just physical abuse. It can also be emotional, psychological, financial, or spiritual. At its core, it's about one person using power and control over another. It can happen to anyone, regardless of age, gender, income, or faith.

As a church, we are called to be a place of refuge and healing. Scripture reminds us in Psalm 34:18, "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." Our community must reflect that same nearness and compassion.

What can we do as a congregation?

- Listen without judgment if someone confides in you. Your support can be life-saving.
- **Know the signs**, such as unexplained injuries, withdrawal from church or social activities, or sudden changes in behavior.
- Refer individuals to professional help, such as local shelters, counselors, or hotlines.
- Pray for healing—for victims, survivors, and even perpetrators seeking change.
- Educate yourself and others, breaking the cycle of silence and shame. If you or someone you know is experiencing domestic violence, help is available. Please reach out to a trusted church leader or contact the *National Domestic Violence Hotline at 800-799-SAFE (7233)* for confidential support.

Let us be a church that not only speaks about love but lives it—by standing against abuse in all its forms. Our next **BP** screening is October 19th after mass. **Our Diabetes class** is going very well, we have 17 people in the class. Thank you church.


