First Sunday of Advent

On this First Sunday of Advent, we begin a new church year, and in a month we will begin a new calendar year. Endings and beginnings are always good times to take stock of our lives. They give us the freedom to look at what we'd like to leave behind and what we'd like to take into the new year. It's like clearing the slate and starting anew. The Gospel today calls us to stay awake and be alert when Christ breaks into our lives. It calls us not to become complacent from the trappings of the holidays. This season can be a time of busyness and distraction. It can be a time when we shop too much and buy things we don't need. It can be a time of eating more that we should and spending our days in full motion. If this is our Advent, nothing in our lives will change and we'll be exhausted when it's all over.

Catholic Corner: The Redeemer

In the reading from Isaiah, three times the author refers to God as *our father;* not in the sense of creator but <u>as redeemer</u>. The *redeemed* now had a life as sharers in God's love. Fast forward to our time and who is our redeemer but God Jesus, to whom (according to St. Paul), we have been called <u>into</u> fellowship; to be sharers in a common purpose, to love God and to love each other, to build the Kingdom here and now, and to call upon God Holy Spirit to be our guide in all things.

Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture readings express the Advent themes of hope, vigilance, and repentance. The Prophet Isaiah desires his people to atone for their sinful ways and turn their hardened hearts back to the Lord, who has done great deeds for them. In St. Mark's Gospel, Jesus urges us to be watchful and alert, for we do not know when He will return. St. Paul reminds the Corinthian community, and us, that fellowship with our Lord strengthens us with many spiritual gifts — a timely reminder as we begin our journey into this Advent season.

May we, as faithful stewards, put our hope in the Lord, acknowledge our sins, and seek with contrite hearts, His mercy and forgiveness. Advent is an excellent time to confess our sins by participating in the sacrament of Reconciliation.
