

"With a Frayer..."

Praised be Jesus Christ! Jesus goes into the desert for forty days and forty nights. We have begun our forty days and forty nights of **making straight in the desert a highway for our God (Isaiah 40:3).** During these days, to open ourselves more to Jesus and His way, we fast, we give alms, and we pray more.

Pastor's Pen

This past Sunday was a real blessing. Thanks to everyone who came out for Mass and then came down to the basement afterwards.

Black History Month. I had a chance last Sunday to stop by the Solanus Center to see the exhibit by local young artists who have painted portraits of American Black Catholics. It's really well done. Good research. Inspiring talent. I hope you can stop by, see the exhibit and ask Father Solanus to pray for us in the parish.

Lent. James 1:22 tells us, "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only." We show that we have been saved by faith and grace by doing the Word. In Lent we do the word by praying more (daily rosary? Morning and Evening Prayer? Divine Mercy Chaplet? Praying with the Day's Mass readings? Stations of the Cross on Friday?) by fasting more (fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, abstaining from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays during Lent), and by almsgiving (by justice, we all tithe, which means to support the Church; by almsgiving we go beyond justice to charity and help those in need). Keep your eye on the prize: a closer walk with Jesus, knowing the love of our Heavenly Father, receiving new life in the Holy Spirit.

Lenten bible study/Faith Sharing. Lent is a good time to join a bible study or faith sharing group. Please see other places in the bulletin for further information.

Covid19 protocols. The Center for Disease Control has lifted its warning about social distancing at six feet. Because a good number of our parishioners have underlying health concerns or are caring for those who have such concerns, we will continue to social distance and wear masks in the part of the church in front of the ambo. Southeast Michigan no longer has a high level of the virus being transmitted, but we will keep an eye on it. Because of the possibility of passing the virus through the chalice, we will stop sharing the chalice for a while. When we receive Jesus in the sacred host, we receive the whole Christ, not just a part of Him.

Preferences for Mass times. Last Sunday, we were given the chance to give our preferences to either 1.) keep the current Mass schedule; 2.) change the Mass time at Nativity to 9:45 and St. Charles to 11:15. Most people who expressed their preference did so on Sunday, but others either called into the parishes or sent emails by Tuesday noon. At Nativity, the preference was to stay at the same time by a margin of two to one. At St. Charles, the preferences were split down the middle with half favoring a change and half wanting to stay at 11:30. Several people said they had no preference.

I appreciate the members of the parishes who raised the question about changing the Mass times. Those who asked for the change expressed their concern about people who are no longer attending Mass at our parishes; their concern was not just about convenience. Because of the outcome of how people expressed their preferences/views, we will stay with the current Mass schedule.



Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms. The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages individuals to report clergy sexual abuse of minors and others directly to law enforcement – no matter when the abuse occurred. The Michigan Attorney General's Office has established a toll-free reporting hotline at (844- 324-3374, Monday through Friday, 8 am to 5pm.r aginvestigations@michigan.gov). Individuals also may contact their local police department. For complaints involving priests, deacons, religious, or laity, individuals are welcomed to contact the Archdiocese of Detroit's Victim Assistance Coordinator at (866) 343-8055 or vac@aod.org.


