Sirach and Jesus remind us that our speech is more than just words but reveals our deeper selves and can have a profound influence on others.

"The fruit of a tree shows the care that it has had; So too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before they speak, For it is then that people are tested."

As we all know, our tongues can be sharp swords of negativity, judgment and harshness to other people. Our tongues can also be used to compliment, build up and show compassion to others. The test of our words is the fruit of our lives. Have we drawn people to us by the kindness of our words or have we driven them away because of the harshness of our tone or the negativity of our words? I bet all of us can remember some harsh and hurtful words that we have carried with us since our childhood from parents or siblings or friends or classmates. I suspect that people who spoke these words never realized the power they would have over another person's life. We may also remember the words of encouragement and love that we have carried from those who may never know how much their words comforted us and continue to give us strength today. We have great power in the way we use our tongues. What we may see as a harmless critique may be devastating to someone else. Maybe this Lent we can monitor our tongues a bit more and use them to build one another up. May our words produce wondrous fruit in our lives and in the lives of all who walk with us.
