Fifth Sunday of Lent

As you may have noticed, I'm not there today. I had to fly to NY this morning for a friend's father's funeral on Monday. We grew up together and his father was a wonderful man and I have to be there. I'm sure Br. Robert and George will be great!

This Sunday, as in the last Sundays, we have an option as to which readings we can choose. The B readings are the regular readings, but we can opt for A readings when we have someone coming into the church who is going through the "scrutinies" before baptism. The scrutinies involve a radical look at life by those who are coming into the church as well as for the rest of us. I would have used the A readings had I been there, but the other brothers may use the B readings. So, here's what I would have said.

The Gospel in the A readings is the story of the raising of Lazarus. We hear the story of Lazarus, already in the tomb for four days, being called back to life. We hear Mary and Martha say to Jesus, "If you had been here, my brother would never have died." How often have we said something like that when tragedy strikes? Where was God when I needed Him most? I have no answers about suffering, but it is part of life. We will all struggle with suffering and death, with broken dreams and disappointments, with hurts and betrayals, etc What I realize as I've gotten older is that God will never leave us in the suffering but will stay with us and walk us to new life. Our new life may not be the old life we had and it may be, as they say, the "new normal" but it will be filled with the grace necessary to keep going and find joy again. How often have we said after a tragedy, "If you ever told me this was going to happen, I would have told you I couldn't do it. Yet, somehow, I had what I needed to get through." That's the grace of God always calling us from death to new life. It's the Christian story! Death has no power over the grace of God's new life for us. So if you're going through difficult days now and it feels like death, remember it's only a moment and new life is coming. Grace is on its way and all will be well!

Catholic Corner: The Seeds That Grow

In the Parable of the Sower, as recorded in the first three gospels, Jesus explained to the disciples that the "seed" that was sown is the word of God that bore fruit depending on the hearer's response to the message contained therein.

In John's gospel, Jesus tells Philip and Andrew that the seed would bear fruit only if it is buried and dies. Jesus is the seed-the grain of wheat-who is about to die in order to pave the way back to the glory of God through his Resurrection. We, who have been baptized in Christ, must also pass through death to resurrection. We must "die" to our impulse to put ourselves before God and others.
