

#### Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse: "No One Above Civil or God's Law"

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for accountability universal in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for preliminary conductina investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms on May 9. They go into effect June 1. ### Stewardship Minute: Fourth Sunday of Lent

Today's Scripture passages center on blindness — both physical blindness and not seeing what God seeks to reveal to us. In St. John's Gospel, the evangelist tells of Jesus curing the blind man at the Pool of Siloam. But the Pharisees, the lawyers of Jesus' day, do not accept his account of the healing and expel him from the synagogue — the Pharisees are blind to Jesus' mission. In the First Book of Samuel, the Lord chooses David as king rather than his brothers and proclaims to Samuel: *Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart.* In St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, he reminds us to live in the Lord as children of the light. As faithful stewards on a journey to holiness, what blinds us from full union in Christ? This Lenten season, make your prayer life a priority. Draw closer to the Lord through daily communication with Him, remembering to also take time to listen.
