Pastor's Pen



From the pen of Sister Ellen Burkhardt:

This coming weekend, June 2-3, St. Charles and Nativity Parishes will welcome Fr. Peter Dougherty to our Masses. Fr. Dougherty is from the Lansing diocese and will preach on the readings of the day and also introduce us to Meta Peace Team. Meta Peace Team (MPT) works collaboratively with peace and justice groups both in the United States and around the world. Since MPT began in 1993, they have held numerous trainings in nonviolent conflict intervention, and hundreds of people have been trained. Those trained are putting their skills to use in their homes, workplaces and communities. Some commit as a volunteer for MPT and are deployed both at home and abroad in regions of conflict at the invitation of the communities involved. Two local examples of Peace Team activity were at the March for Our Lives rally in Detroit when members from both our parishes marched in support of the young people asking for gun reform, and at the Poor People's Campaign that is currently being held each Monday in Lansing to call upon the energy and vision of the original campaign that began with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. 50 years ago as we seek to address the same goals today.

Three weeks from now, Peter and another Peace Team Member will present an all-day nonviolence training for both parishes. **The training will be on Saturday, June 23 at Nativity. Mark your calendars so that you won't miss this chance to learn about the power of Gospel Nonviolence as well as learn Violence De-escalation Skills to use in your own life.** Participants will explore nonviolence in the "big picture", what it means, how it is used, and how good-hearted, well-intentioned individuals can disagree yet still work together. Perhaps most importantly, the training will teach the skills to de-escalate a potentially violent situation. I attended this training a year ago and I know that you will find the tools helpful in everyday Peacemaking in your own life. More information will be coming in the weeks ahead.

PROMOTE THE VOTE is a broad coalition working to get a ballot initiative to amend the Michigan Constitution to provide certain voting rights. By making voting more accessible and secure, our democracy will better serve all Americans and our laws will better reflect the will of the people. Everyone -- Republicans, Democrats and Independents -- deserves to have their vote secure and counted.

This amendment to the Michigan Constitution would provide a common-sense approach to safeguarding our elections, put voters first, and remove barriers for working families by:

- Protecting the right to vote a secret ballot
- Ensuring military service members and overseas voters get their ballots in time for their votes to count
- Providing voters with the option to vote straight party
- Automatically registering citizens to vote at the Secretary of State's office, unless the citizen declines
- Allowing a citizen to register to vote anytime with proof of residency
- Providing all registered voters access to an absentee ballot for any reason
- Ensuring the accuracy and integrity of elections by auditing election results.

Stewardship Thoughts

A Trinitarian theme — three persons in one God — connects today's Scripture readings. In the First Reading from Deuteronomy, Moses professes that due to God's uniqueness, people should be inspired to follow His directives. According to St. Paul's Letter to the Roman community, the Spirit permits us to become adopted children and heirs through Christ — Roman society held adopted children in high esteem. In a powerful evangelization message from St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus commissions His Apostles: *"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit."*

Do we, as faithful stewards, realize our baptismal call, our gift of discipleship from the Lord? Moved by the Holy Trinity, do we express this discipleship in a spirit of evangelization by welcoming home our brothers and sisters who have left the faith, and those who do not know Christ? 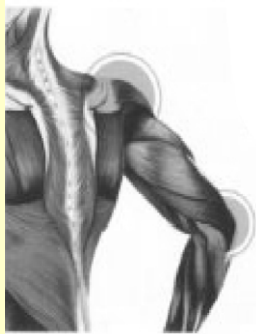
Natural Family Planning Support & Education Series: Deeper Reflections... June 26th at Sacred Heart Major Seminary.
