

Evangelization. Our evangelization visits continue this week. I am sorry for the mix-up in dates last week and thank those who came out on Monday. We will go out this week on **Wednesday at 7**. This past Wednesday, I was able to pray with two households, both from the parish; we prayed for the families of the children killed in Uvalde, Texas, for the families of the people killed in Buffalo, as well as for their families.

Me and My Family We will serve the Lord. Joshua 24:15. At a crisis point during the Exodus, Joshua told the people to choose whom they would serve: the gods of the past or the gods of the people in the Land, or the LORD. Along with all the economic and social problems leading to violence and hatred in our society, a major spiritual problem is that many people have stopped following the LORD. We choose the Lord by protesting against injustice and praying for an end to the violence and hatred which spirits other than the spirit of God incite. So, this summer we will continue the tradition of prayer started by Mr. Leon Dixon in "Take Back the Night." We will pray at the main corners in the three of our parishes as well as other parishes on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights from 8 until 9 PM. We will have signs promoting the three responses of the NAACP to the Buffalo killings: gun control, equal use of de-escalating tactics, holding accountable media sources that promote racial hatred. We will also pray the Rosary, or if people of other churches join us, the Divine Mercy chaplet. This week, we will be at the corner of Mack and Van Dyke on Tuesday, and the corner of Jefferson and the Boulevard on Wednesday. Please consider joining this prayer.

Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse:

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms. See detroitcatholic.com to learn more. He will be welcomed to the Archdiocese of Detroit at a Liturgy of Welcome and Inauguration of Ministry on July 7, 2022 at 2 p.m. at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Detroit. The Descent of the Holy Spirit

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles, "with a sound from heaven, as of a violent wind blowing." Often, when the Holy Spirit comes to us, it is quietly. During the Mass, the Holy Spirit is invoked over the congregation and over the bread and wine.

At Mass, the consecration bells have been rung at St. Charles in the past years when the Word of God come upon the bread and wine and change them. It is also a permitted custom to ring them at the epiclesis, the time when the Holy Spirit is invoked on the bread and wine. The Word of God and the Spirit of God, sent by the One Jesus called "Father" change us and they change the bread and wine.

To highlight the presence and action of the Holy Spirit at Mass and in our lives, we will start ringing the consecration bells at the time the Holy Spirit comes upon the gifts.

These days, the Gospel preached to us is about the Holy Spirit and about the Most Holy Trinity, let's open our lives to the Living God and thank God for the love poured out on us.


