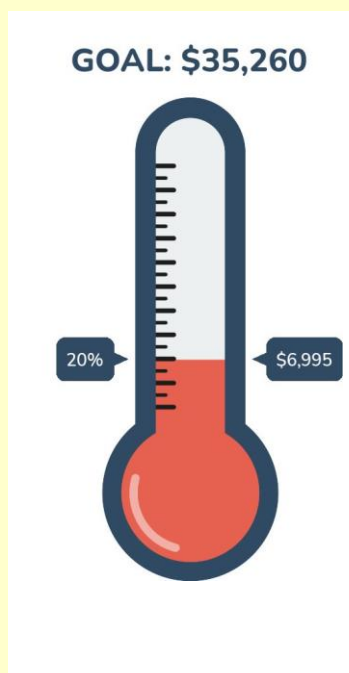
Taking back the night and the day. Last week, we prayed at the corner of the Boulevard and Jefferson and on the Belle Isle Bridge. Because we were few in number, we walked, prayed the Rosary, the Divine Mercy chaplet, and prayers from the Novena of Surrender. It was a beautiful evening and a special time to pray for our parish and our neighborhoods.

Parish Family Mass schedule. Daily Mass is a wonderful way of staying in union with Christ. I strongly suggest you try it for two weeks and then see what you see for yourself. In our family, Mass is offered on Tuesdays at Sacred Heart at 5 PM, on Wednesdays at St. Augustine and St. Monica parish at 9am, on Thursdays at 11am at Nativity (beginning next week at 9 AM), and Fridays at St. Charles at 11am.

Upcoming Holy Hours. Beginning **the week June 12th**, we will have Holy Hours on **Wednesdays at 8am at St. Augustine/St. Monica**, on **Thursdays at Nativity at 8am** and at **St. Charles on Fridays at 8am**. The Thursday Holy Hour will begin with a 7-minute teaching from the Desert Fathers on how to pray and act as a follower of Jesus. The Friday Holy Hours will begin with Morning Prayer. We will also have the **8:15pm Holy Hour at St. Augustine/St. Monica** on Thursday evening.

The rectory needs some repairs and repainting. We will be meeting with the Detroit Historic District Commission so that the work we do follows the guidelines for the historic designation that was given in 1986.

Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse:

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms. See detroitcatholic.com to learn more. Individuals with knowledge of sexual abuse by clergy or church representatives are urged to contact local law enforcement and the Michigan Attorney General's office. 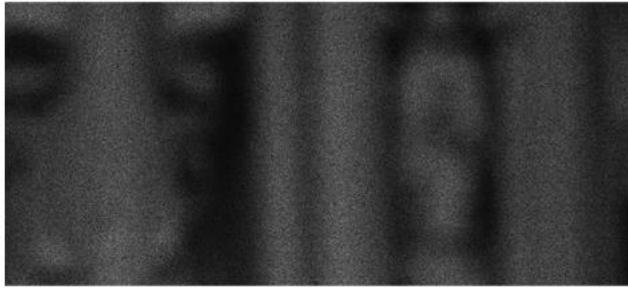

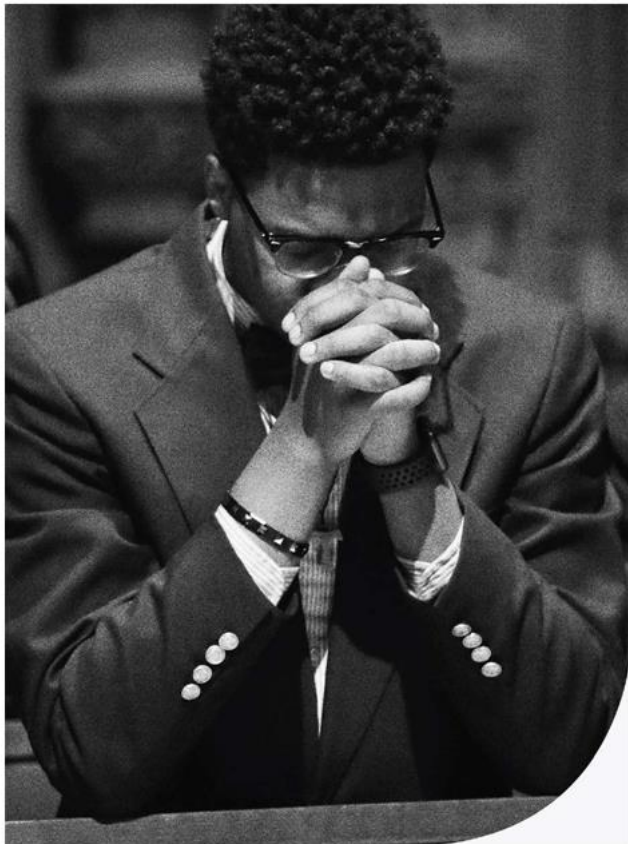

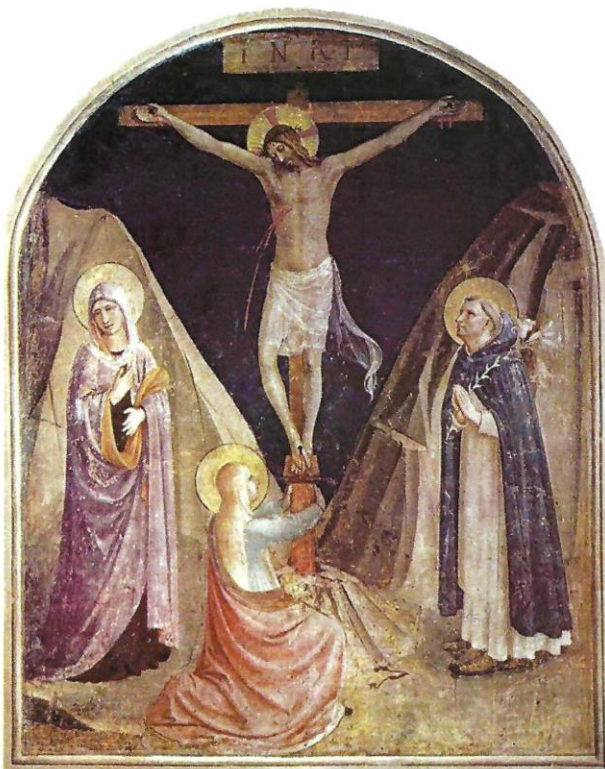
