Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate what us old people called "Corpus Christi" Sunday in our day. In case you're too young to remember, Corpus Christi is Latin for the Body of Christ. I've always appreciated this feast because it not only spoke of the Body and Blood of Christ we receive at Mass each week but the fact that we are called to be the Body of Christ in the world. It's a reminder that although we may not look the same or speak the same or act the same or see life from the same lens, we are all connected. So, when the Body of Christ is suffering at the border of the US or the Body of Christ is suffering in unjust systems that favor the rich and oppress the poor and when the Body of Christ is a child suffering from malnutrition or from the devastating effects of war, then we are all suffering. Each Eucharist we share should remind us of our responsibility as followers of Jesus. We are not here just to do works of charity for suffering people who are really not our "family", but we are here to share the suffering of our brothers and sisters who truly are family. I think of it this way. If one of us had a child or sibling or parent who was treated unfairly and suffering, wouldn't we do everything we could to alleviate their suffering and make things right for them? If one of us had a niece or nephew who didn't have enough food and was hungry, wouldn't we do all in our power to make sure that child had food? Well, on this feast of the Body of Christ, we are called to realize that the suffering people of the world are our sons and daughters, our nieces and nephews, our grandchildren, parents, and our brothers and sisters. Yes, they are us and we are part of them.

When this feast is only about me receiving Jesus at the altar and that's all I have to do, then we've missed the point of the feast and the Gospel. Each Eucharist should jar us from our complacency. When we receive the precious Body and Blood of Christ each week, Christ gives us eyes to see the needs of the poor, hearts to feel the pain and struggle of our brothers and sisters who are treated unfairly and the courage to stand up for what is right. As we receive the Eucharistic bread today, we are reminded that we are what we receive. We are the Body of Christ in the world. When we take the cup, we are taking the cup of suffering in our world and vowing that we might be in solidarity with our suffering brothers and sisters. We further vow to do all in our power to alleviate that suffering even to the point of shedding our own blood. Will you take the cup this week?

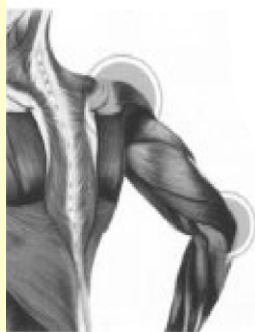

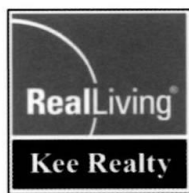

Making a Report of Sexual Abuse

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator contact: **(866) 343-8055**. A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities. The Archdiocese of Detroit stands with the brave survivors who seek to bring the crime of child sexual abuse by clergy and other Church representatives into the light, where those who sinned are confronted and those who were harmed can find healing. To those harmed by the actions and inaction of Church leaders: It is inexcusable, and we are sorry. **In an effort to consolidate our resources and respond to the faithful's questions about clergy sexual abuse, the Archdiocese of Detroit has created a new "mini" website at protect.aod.org.** This site highlights information about reporting abuse, victim assistance, investigations, training for clergy and lay employees and volunteers, and provides additional resources, including messages from Archbishop Vigneron. Our goal is to make this important information – already available on aod.org – more visible, transparent and clear.
