Graduation: God is good! As someone who has been a teacher for 33 years, I love graduation Sunday. Thank God for accomplishment, for giving us grace to pull through near impossible times, for those who care enough to be kind and those who care enough to be tough. Congratulations to our graduates! Whether you can worship today with your parish family or not, we are very happy for you. Stay close to Jesus. Pray in the Holy Spirit. Let God move you in this next new time of your life.

Evangelization. Last week, we visited Seyburn and were able to tell a couple younger families about Vacation Bible School. One toddler saw the flyer with the church's picture on it and asked, "Mommy, can we go to church?" Music to my ears. A Pentecostal woman who grew up on the street remembered coming to St. Charles for VBS when she was a child. Nice to hear the appreciation in her voice. Next week, we'll continue on Seyburn.

Taking back the night and the day. This past week, we prayed at Jefferson and East Grand Boulevard on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday at 8 PM. The evenings were warm, but a beautiful breeze was coming off the river. I've come to think of these evenings as 75% prayer, and 25% encouraging people with messages about prayer, respecting all God's children and better background checks for guns. A good number of people toot their horns and raise their arms in support. A few people shout their disagreement and raise their middle digits in something that doesn't seem to be support.... It's a free country and good to be able to pray and protest in public.

Mass during the week. Daily Mass is a wonderful way of staying in union with Christ. In our family, Mass is offered on Tuesdays at Sacred Heart at 5 PM, on Wednesdays at St. Augustine/St. Monica at 9 AM, at Nativity on Thursdays at 9 AM, and here each Friday at St. Charles at 11 AM. Holy hours are on Wednesday at 8 AM at St. Augustine/St. Monica, Thursday at Nativity and Friday at our parish. After your coffee, come on over and pray and see if it is a good way to start the day.

Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse:

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms. See detroitcatholic.com to learn more. 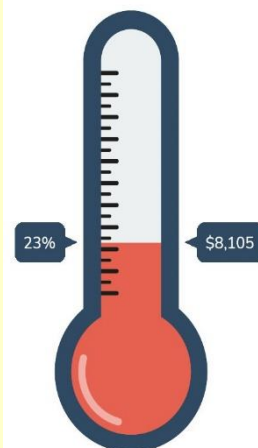

Pope Francis has named Archbishop Paul Fitzpatrick Russell as the 31st auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese of Detroit. He will be welcomed to the Archdiocese of Detroit at a Liturgy of Welcome and Inauguration of Ministry on **July 7, 2022 at 2 p.m.** at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Detroit. 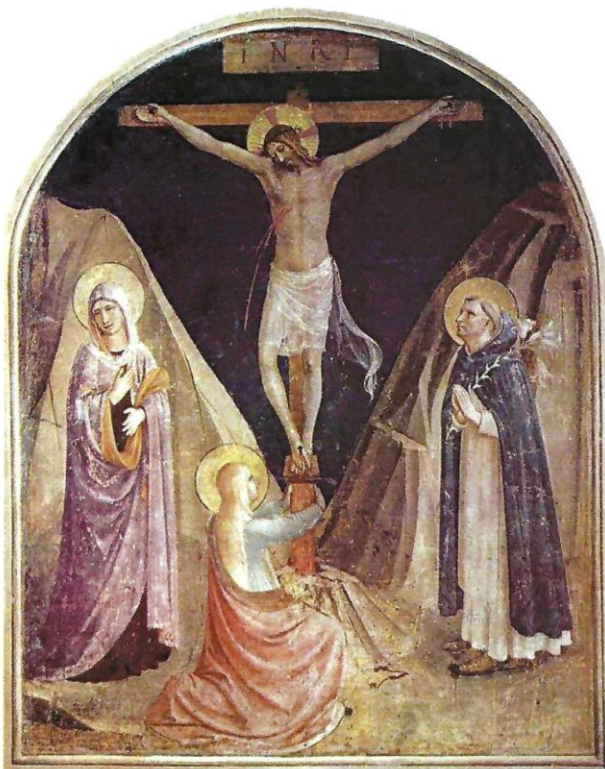
