

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Didn't we have a wonderful time at Mass last Sunday with the children from Vacation Bible School leading us in song and prayer? Again, thank you to Joni Scott and all the volunteers from the kitchen staff preparing the meals to the teachers and teacher's aides to all who had any part in making these three weeks a grand experience for the children. I was able to see the crowd before they left for Cedar Point on Thursday and you could feel the excitement. It truly makes my day when I see the children having a great time. So, thanks to all who made it possible.

Today's Gospel shows Jesus teaching his disciples how to pray. The "Our Father" has become such a common prayer that sometimes we gloss over the words we are praying. A few weeks ago, our wonderful group preparing for baptism went over this prayer line by line with Sr. Judy. The part they and all of us decided was the hardest was the line, "and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." It really is an indictment on how we forgive others. Yikes, it would be much easier to say, "Lord, help us to forgive as you have forgiven us." Forgive us as we forgive others reminds me of the scripture passage that says, "with the measure (of mercy) which you measure shall be measured back to you." I know the times I have been unforgiving and unmerciful and if that becomes the yardstick with which I am judged, I'm in big trouble!

The reminder today is that forgiveness is freedom and when we carry all kinds of resentments and bitterness within us, we hurt ourselves and make our lives miserable. I know when I see the Lord face to face, I will need a lot of forgiveness and mercy, so I don't have the luxury of holding back my forgiveness from those who have hurt me. I also know that forgiveness from deep hurts doesn't just happen because we want it, but those hurts are wounds that slowly heal when we tend to them. Maybe this week we can take a look at the pain and hurts that hamper us from forgiving and invite Christ into those sacred wounds. The "Our Father" is not just a prayer of praise to God in heaven but it is a challenge to our lives and our broken hearts. As we take each other's hands this week to pray this prayer, may we all hear the challenge to begin letting go of some bitterness and hurt that may have been festering in our hearts for many years. May God open our hearts to his love and forgiveness so that we might be able to bring forgiveness to the relationships of our lives!



Making a Report of Sexual Abuse

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator contact: (866) 343-**8055.** A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities. The Archdiocese of Detroit stands with the brave survivors who seek to bring the crime of child sexual abuse by clergy and other Church representatives into the light, where those who sinned are confronted and those who were harmed can find healing. To those harmed by the actions and inaction of Church leaders: It is inexcusable, and we are sorry. In an effort to consolidate our resources and respond to the faithful's questions about clergy sexual abuse, the Archdiocese of Detroit has created a new "mini" website at protect.aod.org. This site highlights information about reporting abuse. victim assistance, investigations, training for clergy and lay employees and volunteers, and provides additional resources, including messages from Archbishop Vigneron. Our goal is to make this important information - already available on aod.org - more visible, transparent and clear.
