

### Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Gospel speaks of the watchful servant awaiting his master's return and the call to be vigilant. We have to keep our eyes open and always be ready. When I hear this story, I am always reminded of the days in school when the teacher would pull a "pop quiz" on us. It was always the day I didn't study, and the feeling of dread would fall on me as I got out my sheet of paper. It feels that way with this gospel. Christ is just waiting for the day when we are not ready and then he'll show up just like that pop quiz! Although this sense of dread swirls in my mind at times, I also know that Christ is not looking to sneak up on me like a test but sneaks up on me to surprise me in the best way Christ comes to us knocking on the door of our lives at each moment and only asks us to welcome him. He will do the rest even to the point of waiting on us as the master in the story does. When Christ is present, there is always tremendous grace. In the daily events of our lives, Christ comes to us in our children who need our love and touch us by their innocence, our spouses who continue to remind us that we're loved unconditionally, those who are struggling who need someone to listen and even in those who are difficult and need our patience. Yes, he breaks into our lives and we experience a taste of the divine in each visit.

We are in a world of mass shootings and vile behavior. There are few to look to for leadership so we must depend on Christ to lead us. His lead is about compassion, justice and mercy for all our brothers and sisters. He calls us in our waiting to be strengthened at this Eucharist so we might be the Body of Christ in the world. We have to stand for something more than the lowest common denominator. We have to go higher and live out of a commitment to foster peace where there is violence, love where there is hatred, courage where there is fear and inclusion where there is separation. Christ comes to us in many disguises and sometimes those disguises don't look anything like us, but he is there and asking to be welcomed. May we be that vigilant servant awaiting Christ's visit!

#### Making a Report of Sexual Abuse

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator contact: (866) 343-**8055.** A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities. The Archdiocese of Detroit stands with the brave survivors who seek to bring the crime of child sexual abuse by clergy and other Church representatives into the light, where those who sinned are confronted and those who were harmed can find healing. To those harmed by the actions and inaction of Church leaders: It is inexcusable, and we are sorry. In an effort to consolidate our resources and respond to the faithful's questions about clergy sexual abuse, the Archdiocese of Detroit has created a new "mini" website at protect.aod.org. This site highlights information about reporting abuse. victim assistance, investigations, training for clergy and lay employees and volunteers, and provides additional resources, including messages from Archbishop Vigneron. Our goal is to make this important information - already available on aod.org - more visible, transparent and clear.
