I am very grateful to Father David for presiding at Mass this morning. Because he was able to change his schedule, I'll be able to offer Mass for the Nativity picnic at noon.

I also want to invite you to Jazz on the Lawn which begins at noon and continues into the evening. This year, to cover costs, we are asking \$10 beforehand and \$15 at the door. If that is too much for you at this point in life, please see me. Parishioners have donated for a bunch of wristbands. Everyone is welcome! There will be food trucks in the lot.

Monday is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. Because it falls this year on a Monday, it is not a holy day of obligation. If you would like to worship at Mass on Monday, please check a parish near where you live; or go to Assumption Grotto parish for Mass; it's their feast day.

**Evangelization.** Jesus tells us about the good things we have received in Matthew 10:8: **the gift you have received, give as a gift.** If Jesus is good news to you and to me, *we have to* share that good news. We do it each according to the personality we have. The gifts of God come to us personally, not mass produced. If you haven't found your voice yet to share the good news you know, think about it, look for a new way to share. Or, ask God to show you how.

**Family news.** In our parish, we had a beautiful Mass last week, followed by a really nice lunch. We received permission from the Historic District Commission to start painting the rectory trim and Paul has begun that good work. At Nativity, the annual picnic is today. Sacred Heart is planning a bazaar in October, details to follow. St. Elizabeth has recently had some repair work done. St. Augustine/St. Monica has their feast days weekend next weekend.

#### Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse:

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms. See detroitcatholic.com to learn more. 


