

Today's Readings

Mark 10:35-45 (Greatness in Serving)

We've all heard of the "Prosperity Gospel" as preached by many TV evangelists. If we believe in Jesus (and maybe send a nice tithe to the minister on TV), we can expect tremendous blessings. The blessings they speak of are material wealth and a higher status among our peers. We will live the good life with Jesus! Perhaps, James and John had already heard of the prosperity gospel in their time. That promise of wealth and security may have been what they expected when they followed this Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus quickly lets them know he is not that type of Messiah. Jesus turns the conversation around and asks them if they're willing to "drink the cup" of suffering and death which he will drink. He reminds us today that when we say yes to discipleship, we are not joining a club but are putting our life on the line. We are saying that we will take the cup of suffering in our lives and try to find new life through love. We are also saying we will sit with those who are suffering in the world and will not abandon them. That's tough stuff!

Our blessing in the midst of our struggles is that we have Christ who loved us enough to share our life and offer himself as the One who suffers along with us. Christ didn't come to take suffering away or even to make our lives easier. Christ came to give us the truth about ourselves. He came to remind us that we are the Beloved of God. We are love so deeply...not just some of us, but all of us! When we allow our hearts to be opened to that reality, then everything changes. Our suffering takes on a new meaning because we aren't going through it alone. No, Christ doesn't take away our suffering, but he will sit with us and love us and offer hope in our darkest moments. And it's in that love that our suffering breaks open our hearts to be more compassionate when the next person suffers as we have. That's our wealth!

None of us would ever ask for any of the suffering we've endured throughout our lives. Yet, as we look back, we will see the wisdom and compassion that was gained on our most difficult days. Suffering in our lives reminds us that we are not in control and life can change in an instant. Each day is a gift to be celebrated!

Maybe this week, we can look back at the struggles from our life and see who was there to support us and love us through the darkest days. These people were the presence of Christ and if you didn't feel anyone was there for you, then realize Christ was there in the stillness of your broken heart, and he, in his love, brought you to this new day!

Making a Report of Sexual Abuse

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator contact: **(866) 343-8055**. A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities.

The Archdiocese of Detroit stands with the brave survivors who seek to bring the crime of child sexual abuse by clergy and other Church representatives into the light, where those who sinned are confronted and those who were harmed can find healing. To those harmed by the actions and inaction of Church leaders: It is inexcusable, and we are sorry. In an effort to consolidate our resources and respond to the faithful's questions about clergy sexual abuse, the Archdiocese of Detroit has created a new "mini" website at protect.aod.org. This site highlights information about reporting abuse, victim assistance, investigations, training for clergy and lay employees and volunteers, and provides additional resources, including messages from Archbishop Vigneron. Our goal is to make this important information – already available on *aod.org* – more visible, transparent and clear.

Stewardship Thoughts

Today, Jesus professes in St. Mark's Gospel, *whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant.* The Book of the Prophet Isaiah and the Letter to the Hebrews also indicate examples of Christ's humility for us to model. In other words, glory in God's Kingdom is not achieved through high status or rank, like the secular world proclaims, but through being a humble servant to all. This includes service to the poor among us.
