Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week our children will be celebrating Halloween with costumes, scary things and, of course, lots of candy. For the Church, Halloween is not the big celebration this week. On Thursday, we will celebrate All Saints' Day. It's a time to remember the canonized Saints in the Church as well as those Saints who have passed through our lives. This is the time to tell stories about how parents, aunts and uncles, cousins and siblings, who have gone before us, have touched our lives and inspired us with their faith and love. This is the season, when in remembering our loved ones, we see how thin the veil is between us and them. As we remember stories and the goodness of their lives, they become present to us in special ways during these moments. There is something very spiritual about these first days in November.

For us, Catholics, we remember our beloved dead with prayer. Many of our Christian brothers and sisters would tell us there is no reason to pray for the dead. Their thought is that once you're dead, it's all over and no prayers can help you. If you haven't gotten right with God by the time you've died, there's nothing more you or anyone can do. We see the mercy and compassion of Christ extending far beyond death and continuing to connect us with those who have gone before us. Our relationship with those we've loved continues beyond death and just as we have prayed for each other on this side of life so we continue praying for each other on the other side of life. I truly appreciate that connection and know that many of my loved ones are interceding for me from their place in heaven. The preface for the funeral liturgy states:

"For your faithful people, Lord, life is changed but it's not ended."

As we think about the Saints this week, it may be a good time to talk to our children about their grandparents, aunts and uncles or other important people who have gone before us. Tell them funny stories, Tell them about their struggles and their courage. Tell them about the faith they had when they were going through a difficult period in their lives. We often stop telling stories of our loved ones and our children and grandchildren are deprived of the richness of their lives. They lose the connection with the heroes in their family. This week is a good moment to sit down with the kids and tell them the wonderful stories of those who have been so important in our lives. May this great band of witnesses from our families laugh with us in our celebrations, and cry with us in our heartbreak. May they encourage us to do our best in life and help us in running the race before us. May we always realize we have them at our side to root for us and comfort us in all the moments of this life!

Making a Report of Sexual Abuse

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator contact: **(866) 343-8055**. A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities.

The Archdiocese of Detroit stands with the brave survivors who seek to bring the crime of child sexual abuse by clergy and other Church representatives into the light, where those who sinned are confronted and those who were harmed can find healing. To those harmed by the actions and inaction of Church leaders: It is inexcusable, and we are sorry. In an effort to consolidate our resources and respond to the faithful's questions about clergy sexual abuse, the Archdiocese of Detroit has created a new "mini" website at protect.aod.org. This site highlights information about reporting abuse, victim assistance, investigations, training for clergy and lay employees and volunteers, and provides additional resources, including messages from Archbishop Vigneron. Our goal is to make this important information – already available on *aod.org* – more visible, transparent and clear.

Stewardship Thoughts

In today's Gospel, the evangelist St. Mark tells of Jesus' healing of Bartimaeus when witnessing this blind beggar's faith. He is then moved to discipleship in Christ and follows our Lord on the road. The prophet Jeremiah also illustrates the journey of God's deliverance of the ancient Israelites from Babylonian captivity. In the Letter to the Hebrews, the inspired author expresses how God calls men to the priesthood.

In our quest for discipleship that begins at our Baptism, do we have the faith and courage to answer God's invitation to our life's vocation? Are we praying for solid families — the "Domestic Church" — that will be the seedbeds for vocations to the priesthood, religious life, permanent diaconate, and lay ministries?
