# Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we hear the word that generosity will never go unnoticed by God. Regardless of whether others appreciate or realize your sacrifices, God does. In the first reading from the Book of Kings, God noticed the beauty of the widow of Zarephath who was on her last ounce of flour and yet still agreed to prepare a little cake for her visitor, Elijah. Jesus also noticed, with great love, the sacrifice the widow made in dropping her last coins in the treasury.

God has noticed all the times you've put yourself out for other people. God noticed the middle of the night vigils when you had a sick child. God noticed the patience you've had (or tried to have) in answering the same question a hundred times for a member of the family suffering from Alzheimer's disease. God noticed when you helped your frail parent go grocery shopping even though you were exhausted. God noticed when you've been there to support your children when they've gotten into trouble. God noticed when you've sacrificed to send your children to good schools. God noticed when you had to work two jobs to keep your family afloat. God noticed all your sleepless nights as you worried about a family member. God noticed all the times you helped a senior neighbor to shovel the snow or cut the grass. God noticed the time you made room in your home for an aging parent who could no longer live alone. God noticed the stress you were under in getting your dish together for the funeral luncheon of someone you didn't even know. God noticed the times you drove people to doctor's appointments, chemotherapy, dialysis, etc. and never complained. God noticed the times you allowed someone else to take credit for something you had done or the times you took the blame for something you hadn't done. God noticed the sacrifices it took to raise your children without the other parent. God noticed the times you went without things for yourself so that the children would have enough. God noticed how well you took care of your grandchild when their parent was unable to care for them.

Yes, just as God noticed the goodness of the widow of Zarephath and the widow who placed the two coins in the treasury, God has noticed all your many sacrifices and your goodness to other people in your life. I'm not sure that God blesses us after every act of kindness but I know God never forgets and God's heart is moved whenever we love another. As generous as we may be, God will never be outdone in generosity and there will be a day when God will thank us for the goodness we have brought to the world. So, when you're having a day like the widow of Zarephath and feel you're on your last ounces of flour and don't see how anything can get better, please remember that God notices it all and is pleased with all your love and sacrifice. And one day, either in this life or the next, God will surprise you with generosity beyond your wildest imaginings!

# Making a Report of Sexual Abuse

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator contact: (866) 343-8055. A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities.

The Archdiocese of Detroit stands with the brave survivors who seek to bring the crime of child sexual abuse by clergy and other Church representatives into the light, where those who sinned are confronted and those who were harmed can find healing. To those harmed by the actions and inaction of Church leaders: It is inexcusable, and we are sorry. In an effort to consolidate our resources and respond to the faithful's questions about clergy sexual abuse, the Archdiocese of Detroit has created a new "mini" website at *protect.aod.org*. This site highlights information about reporting abuse, victim assistance, investigations, training for clergy and lay employees and volunteers, and provides additional resources, including messages from Archbishop Vigneron. Our goal is to make this important information – already available on *aod.org* – more visible, transparent and clear.


