

"With a Frayer..."

Praised be Jesus Christ! This morning we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent and we begin reflecting on how to cooperate with grace so that Christ may increase in us and that His Light shines more through our lives. How much time will you commit to pray each week? To spend time with your family? To give a dedicated financial contribution? To serve through the parish? God calls us to **hesed**, that is to family relationships that are warm, and dependable. What binds us to God, through Jesus, are covenantal bonds, not just a contract. To live in those warm, dependable relationships, we need to sometimes repent of treating God like a slot machine or credit card. Let us rejoice in the living God!

Advent. The Holy Spirit calls us to worship Jesus, the Infant King born in Bethlehem, to prepare the way of Jesus for His final coming and to meet Jesus now within us, around us, in those we meet. We also thank the Lord for the wondrous gift to all of us of Our Lady, the Mother of God and our Mother, Mary. Because this gift of Mary and who she is for us in Christ, Thursday is a holy day of obligation; we'll have three Masses that day, if you can't make Mass at our parish at 6 PM, please come to Nativity at 9 AM or St. Augustine/St. Monica at noon. Worshipping together helps unite us.

Because a good number of our parishioners have underlying health concerns or are caring for those who have such concerns, we will continue to social distance and wear masks in the part of the church in front of the ambo. Southeast Michigan no longer has a high level of the virus being transmitted, but we will keep an eye on it.

Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse


A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms. The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages individuals to report clergy sexual abuse of minors and others directly to law enforcement – no matter when the abuse occurred. The Michigan Attorney General's Office has established a toll-free reporting hotline at (844- 324-3374, Monday through Friday, 8 am to 5pm.r aginvestigations@michigan.gov). Individuals also may contact their local police department. For complaints involving priests, deacons, religious, or laity, individuals are welcomed to contact the Archdiocese of Detroit's Victim Assistance Coordinator at (866) 343-8055 or vac@aod.org.


