# Second Sunday of Advent

Isaiah has a beautiful reading today. I often think when I read this that Isaiah understands God's mind when God is daydreaming about his hopes for the world. Part of this section has been on our Christmas cards at one time or another:

"Then the wolf will be the guest of the lamb, And the leopard will lie down with the kid; The wolf and the young lion shall browse together, With a little child to guide them. The cow and the bear shall be neighbors, Together their young shall rest; The lion shall eat hay like the ox. The baby shall play in the cobra's den, And the child lay his hand on the adder's lair. There shall be no harm or ruin on my holy mountain; For the earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the Lord As water covers the earth."

These are beautiful images of peace and serenity. They call us to a time when all of creation will be in right relationship. How God must yearn for that day. Can we even imagine a world where peace flows throughout the land? Can we envision a day when global warming will be a thing of the past? Can we allow ourselves to entertain the notion of a day when we hear of no mass shootings, no terrorist attacks, and no one killed in any kind of violence? Can we imagine a day when money will be spent on food for hungry children, schools, medical care for all, supportive housing for mentally ill and services that support those who are most vulnerable among us rather than on Defense budgets? Can we dream of a day when there are no homeless people because everyone has a place to stay and all have found the road to recovery from drugs? When we can begin to imagine a new world, then we can begin to understand the dreams of God for our world? Will we allow ourselves during this Advent season to daydream with God and then ask God what our part is in his glorious dream?

## **CSA Minute:** *Hispanic Ministries*

Bishop Arturo Cepeda will celebrate Mass at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral this **Wednesday, December 11**, in honor of an important feast day to our Hispanic Catholic community.

The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Juan Diego, a native Mexican, twice in 1531 on Tepeyac hill near Mexico City. We celebrate the feast in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. St. Juan Diego's feast day is December 9.

Gifts to the CSA help fund Hispanic Ministries, which include conferences for men, women, and youth, as well as religious education, adult faith formation, leadership, and catechist formation programs for Hispanic families.

The celebration of the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe will begin at 5 p.m. with the Rosary followed by singing and dancing. Bishop Cepeda will celebrate Mass at 7 p.m. For information about CSA-funded ministries, programs, and services, go to *aod.org.* 

#### Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse: "No One Above Civil or God's Law"

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior.

"I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law."

Pope Francis announced the new norms on May 9. They go into effect June 1. To learn more about the groundbreaking new church law, go to *detroitcatholic.com*.
