

Sunday, December 11, 2022 Third Sunday of Advent (A Cycle)



"With a Frayer..."

Praised be Jesus Christ! Today we celebrate **the comfort of the Lord** prophesized in Isaiah and revealed today in Jesus. Jesus is able to heal, cure and restore those who are not scandalized by Him, so He tells us today in Matthew 11. Literally, to be scandalized is to trip upon a stone, "a stumbling block." Jesus remains "the stone rejected by the builders (i.e., that is, the important ones)." We have to humble ourselves before Jesus the Lord, refraining from judging the Judge, thinking we are more gracious than the Savior. Then, His healing, curing and restoration can happen and the great paradox of being important in God's eyes is revealed.

Thanks to all who came out this past Sunday afternoon for our Family of Parishes Advent revival. Fr. Thomas and Fr. Preuss came to lead prayer and pray the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Deacon Sanders preached about his life as a disciple in the Church. The prayer teams prayed. The choir sang. Those of us who were able to come were blessed.

We try to balance out the Sunday schedule, but there are often special occasions that change things. As it is, I get to be here again this week and am happy for the chance. This year, we won't be having a special Advent penance service, so if you'd like to go to confession and weren't able to on Sunday, please go to the monastery or a parish nearby.

The spiritual writers always encourage us to be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, which means discerning what moves us and responding as we should. These days, please think and pray about how much time you will commit to praying each day, how much time you'll commit to your family, how you'll serve in the parish and support the parish financially.

Las posadas remember the journey of the Holy Family from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Each night of the novena, at St. Augustine/St. Monica we do the traditional short play which beckons us to take care of those like the Holy Family who are cold, hungry and in need of lodging. 

We acknowledge that it is the Holy Spirit who calls and empowers us, who strengthens and renews us, and who gives us the will to continue our mission, until Jesus comes.

Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioceses to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeply sorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms. The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages individuals to report clergy sexual abuse of minors and others directly to law enforcement – no matter when the abuse occurred. The Michigan Attorney General's Office has established a toll-free reporting hotline at (844- 324-3374, Monday through Friday, 8 am to 5pm.r aginvestigations@michigan.gov). Individuals also may contact their local police department. For complaints involving priests, deacons, religious, or laity, individuals are welcomed to contact the Archdiocese of Detroit's Victim Assistance Coordinator at (866) 343-8055 or vac@aod.org.
