"Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. The Lord is near."

It's Gaudete Sunday (Rejoice Sunday) and we light the rose colored candle on the Advent wreath as a sign that Christ is near and there's reason for rejoicing. We live in the grand expectation that Christ will be here any moment.

It seems like we can get through just about anything if we know help or relief is on the way. We can get through the rigors of school if we know one day we will graduate. We can put up with a grouchy boss if we know one day we will have a career that we love. We can put up with the ice and cold of winter if we know that spring will return. We can put up with the pain after surgery if we know we are healing and getting better each day. We can put up with lots of hard work if we know we will be getting time off in the future. We can put up with grueling exercise if we know our body will be in better shape. Religious Education News: The Jesse Tree

The Jesse Tree's relevance is multifaceted. It enables us to get a full survey of salvation history. We are connected to the central themes of Christian faith: that we have been made by an all-loving God and pursued by him in love when we have so often strayed and cut ourselves off from him.

- 1. <u>David Ornament—Shepherd's Crook or Harp</u> David, a shepherd to the People. David describes God as a rock, fortress, deliverer, shield, horn, stronghold, and refuge. God's covenant love is steadfast and enduring.
- Hezekiah Ornament—An Empty Tent the Reign of Hezekiah. Ahaz was not faithful to God, engaging in such contemptible practices as sacrificing one of his sons in the Canaanite way. When Ahaz died, he was replaced by his surviving son. Hezekiah tried to make up for his father's unfaithfulness.
- 3. <u>Jeremiah Ornament—Tears</u> Jeremiah the Prophet. Jeremiah teaches that the people cannot pray faithfully if they continue to oppress the immigrants, the orphans, and the widows.
- 4. <u>Nehemiah Ornament: City Wall</u> Nehemiah Reform and Renewal. After persuading the king to let him return to Judah, Nehemiah was named governor and given permission to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.
- Isaiah Ornament—Fire Tongs with Hot Coal Elijah fights the False God. God now calls Elijah to confront Ahab and pagan gods. He is going into enemy territory: Jezebel is killing off the prophets of Israel. In spite of the danger, Elijah is not put off.
- 6. <u>Habakkuk Ornament—Stone Watchtower</u> Acknowledging that he does not understand God's will, Habakkuk stands ready to hear what God has planned.
