Catholic Corner

Luke gives us a picture of a devout Hebrew couple, Mary and Joseph, who have brought their first born son to Jerusalem, on the eighth day of his birth, so that he may be circumcised and "designated as holy to the Lord" as was prescribed by God's law. But then an extraordinary event happened that caused the mother and father to be amazed at this child of theirs: A man went into the temple, took the baby into his arms and praised God for allowing him to see the salvation that God had promised. After blessing the couple, the man went on to say to his mother that this child was going to be disturber of the status quo, "destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed..." This prophet, called Simeon, also told Mary that "a sword will pierce your own soul too."
