Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

I will leave the first reading and the Gospel for the homily today and stick with Paul's letter to the Ephesians. I was intrigued by Paul's words: "put off the old self of your former way of life...and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth."

Changing any of our bad habits is a difficult task. We only have to ask smokers, or dieters, or addicts or any of those who have made a significant change in their lives. Paul makes it sound as easy as taking off an old shirt and putting on a new one. Change in behaviors is a difficult task and takes a lot of sacrifice and determination. I continue to be inspired by the men in the ROPE program. They have decided to put off the "old self" and embrace new life. They have come to the conclusion that the "old self" wasn't working any more and they felt those NA words rang true: "I'm sick and tired of being sick and tired." What I realize from the men is that conversion in life takes all that you have. You can't sit on the fence or dabble in your old ways. Either you give it all up or you don't bother. They further realize that recovery is so much more than abstaining from alcohol and drugs but it's embracing a whole new lifestyle. It's a life that calls them to be honest and to let go of old ways of scheming and manipulating others to get what they want. They begin to look at deeper issues that have been covered over and medicated by their old selves. To take off the "old self" and put on the "new self" is a heroic journey. They continue to tell me that this difficult trek is well worth the sacrifice because they've experienced a freedom they had never known in the old lives. Putting on the "new self" has given them a new perspective on themselves, the world and all those they love.

Putting on the new self and going through conversion of heart in each of our lives is often a monumental task. It's easier to embrace the comfortable old self than to set out on a new journey of growth and conversion. So, what old parts of ourselves do we have to leave behind so new life can come? Are we addicted to food or other substances that have gotten out of control? Are we constantly filled with negativity and find ourselves fighting with those we love? Are we always worried and fearful and unable to risk anything? Are we able to forgive and move on from some of the hurts in our life? Are we stuck in judgmental attitudes or self-righteous behavior? Christ continues to call us out of the ruts of the "old self" into a freedom of life that is filled with deeper wells of love and joy. Do we really want to sit back with our comfortable old selves and slowly wither and die or are we willing to allow new life in and change some of those things that are hurting our lives? Please, let's work on one behavior that is old and stagnant and put on a new attitude that calls us to embrace our lives in a new way. Christ is waiting on the other side of our conversion to help us put on that new self!!
