Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

I remember when I was in formation as a Capuchin, we would have classes on communication skills. One of the components to these classes was a day on "active listening." During these classes, we would listen to each other and then respond with the phrase, "what I hear you saying is..." The phrase helped the listener to check in with the speaker to see if what he heard was actually what the speaker intended to say. Most of us thought it was a useless exercise and a waste of time. We said, "Of course, we hear what the other guy said. Our ears are fine, and we heard it all." The problem was most of us didn't get it right when we were telling the other person what we "heard" them say. It's one thing to hear and another to truly listen to the person speaking. It takes a lot more energy and attention to listen. I have to be honest. There are times when I'm hearing and nodding but not really listening. During the conversation, I am thinking of the point I want to make when the person finishes or have a solution for the problem the person is sharing or maybe just daydreaming about the things I have to do that day. Just think of how often we judge a person or size up a situation before the person even gets out the first line of their conversation. I have often been told by people after I listen for a while and come up with a solution for their lives that they weren't looking for answers or a solution. They just wanted someone to listen to them.

Real listening calls us to be with the other person in a deeper way. By giving them our full attention and taking the time to truly listen, we can hear not only the words but the emotions behind the words. We can see the other in a different light and hear their words in a different way. Lately, we have watched the great divide in politics and it certainly seems most don't want to listen to the other side but only desire to get their point across. That's why we have so little legislation enacted these days. No one is willing to listen for the things that unite us.

Jesus says to the man in the Gospel today, "Ephphatha," which means "be opened." After he is able to hear, he is also able to speak plainly. Christ calls us to be opened to his word and to the words of one another. We have to listen before we speak. If we can truly listen, we will hear the cry of the poor in new ways. We will no longer look for quick solutions or easy answers but will hear the struggle and true needs of our brothers and sisters. Maybe this week we can discipline ourselves to listen to one another. Maybe we can talk a bit less (if we're big talkers) and listen a bit more deeply than we have in the past. Maybe people don't need our advice or our solutions. Maybe they just want us to listen. To listen with the heart takes work. It calls us to put our egos to the side and humbly sit with the other listening to the mystery of another person's story. May the Lord open our ears to hear with the heart of Christ!

In an effort to consolidate our resources and respond to the faithful's questions about clergy sexual abuse, the Archdiocese of Detroit has created a new "mini" website at protect.aod.org. This site hiahliahts information about reporting abuse. victim assistance, investigations, training for clergy and lay employees and volunteers, and provides additional resources, including messages from Archbishop Vigneron. Our goal is to make this important information - already available on aod.org - more visible, transparent and clear.

All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities.
