

**Welcome home!** I look forward to seeing everyone who feels safe in returning to Mass this Sunday. When I was out last year for several weeks, I appreciated Mass being livestreamed, but there is nothing like the Real Presence of Christ, both in His Eucharistic Body and in the members of Christ's Body gathered in worship on Sunday. We're glad you are able to come for Mass and I look forward to seeing you at the end of Mass.

**Covid19 protocols.** The Center for Disease Control has lifted its warning about social distancing at six feet. Because a good number of our parishioners have underlying health concerns or are caring for those who have such concerns, we will continue to social distance on the **NORTH** side of the church. We will all continue to wear masks in church, based on a consultation with the parish pastoral council and the fact that Southeast Michigan still has a high level of the virus being transmitted.

**Holy Communion.** Last weekend, we began again to have the option of receiving the real presence of Jesus in the chalice. The Holy Spirit made clear a thousand years ago that when we receive Jesus in only one form (usually under the appearance of bread), we receive the whole Lord. So, we don't have to receive both forms in order to be fully united sacramentally with the Lord.

Over the centuries, for reasons such as the spread of disease, the chalice was limited to the priest; a great gift from the Second Vatican Council was the restoring of the option to receive the Lord from the chalice. This is an option. If you are ill, please do not receive from the chalice, because germs can be passed on even in Communion. Receiving Holy Communion is a time of generous intimacy with the Lord, leading to greater intimacy with other members of His Body. So, if you are healthy, please feel free to receive, or to not receive. Receiving from the chalice is not a test to see if your faith is stronger than your fear of illness; it is a gift from God for those who are able to receive it.

Family Mass schedule during the week. Daily hearing the Word preached and receiving Holy Communion are wonderful ways of staying in union with Christ. In our family, Mass is offered on Tuesdays at Sacred Heart at 5 PM, on Wednesdays at St. Augustine/St. Monica, at Nativity on Thursdays at 9 AM, and each Friday at St.

Catholic Services Appeal. Many of the services (including my salary) which take place in the Archdiocese are paid for by the annual CSA. If you are able to support the Appeal, please make a pledge by calling the office. Our goal this year is \$35,260.00 and we have \$11,270.00 pledged so far. Whatever we receive beyond our goal comes to the parish and is not taxed (7%) by the Archdiocese. Because of commitments to the services and communities provided by the CSA, if we do not reach our goal, we pay it out of our offertory collections. Thanks for considering a donation.

### Archbishop Vigneron's statement on Pope Francis' Global Rules for Reporting Abuse:

A new papal law requiring priests and religious to report sexual abuse and misconduct provides "clear directives for universal accountability in response to the horrors of clergy sexual abuse," Archbishop Vigneron has told Detroit Catholic. The law provides whistleblower protections for anyone making a report and requires all dioces es to have a system in place to receive the claims confidentially. And it outlines internal procedures for conducting preliminary investigations when the accused is a bishop, cardinal or religious superior. "I am deeplysorry to all those who have been injured and are enduring a lifetime of physical, emotional and spiritual suffering because of perverse actions by those in authority," the archbishop said. "No one is above civil law, and importantly, no one is above God's law." Pope Francis announced the new norms. See detroitcatholic.com to learn more. Individuals with knowledge of sexual abuse by clergy or church representatives are urged to contact local law enforcement and the Michigan Attorney General's office.
